Statement of Need

Female Urology and Voiding Dysfunction comprise a significant component of the general urologist's practice. Over the past several years there has been an evolution in the diagnosis and treatment of female urologic conditions as well as post prostatectomy incontinence and neurological voiding dysfunction. Technological and pharmacological advances are constant and outcomes and expectations from such advances must be communicated with our urologic colleagues.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course participants should be able to:

- integrate physical exam, non-invasive testing and urodynamic tests into their practice to improve patient cure through accurate diagnosis
- consider and discuss with peers and patients available treatment options for female urologic conditions such as urinary incontinence, pelvic prolapse, interstitial cystitis and voiding dysfunctions. Furthermore, participants should have the knowledge to present a multi-disciplinary approach when appropriate
- appreciate the technical aspects of procedures for stress incontinence and female pelvic reconstruction that can be incorporated into surgical armamentarium
- understand the etiology and management of post prostatectomy incontinence, including surgical treatment with artificial urinary sphincter and male perineal sling
- understand the workup and management of the patient with neurogenic voiding dysfunction
