Target Audience: Clinicians who treat patients with carcinoma of the prostate

Statement of Need

New information and technology have emerged for prevention, early detection, surgery and treatment of carcinoma of the prostate. A clear understanding of how to incorporate data for scientific studies into clinical practice is necessary. Further, surgeons must be able to separate marketing of new technology from advances that offer real advantages. There are now recognized and established effective treatments for advanced disease that were not available previously. These and other rapid changes mandate that clinicians who treat patients with carcinoma of the prostate stay abreast of these new developments.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the attendee is prepared:

- to relate results of recent randomized prospective scientific studies to clinical patient care for prevention and early detection of carcinoma of the prostate
- to explore techniques and results of robotic surgery and other technologic advantages so that clinicians can identify and take advantage of demonstrated patient advantages
- to learn technical points to improve surgical results with radical prostatectomy
- to understand how to incorporate into clinical practice new treatment options for adjuvant therapy or management of advanced prostate cancer
