Committee Makeup

The committee shall consist of approximately ten (10) Active or Senior Members who shall serve terms of four years. Members will be selected based on known expertise across different domains in urology, with at least one member having focused area of interest in the following urologic surgical areas: BPH, Endourology, Trauma/Reconstruction, Female Pelvic Medicine, Pediatrics and Oncology.

Mission Statement

The Committee is responsible for the audio-visual educational materials shown at the Annual Meeting; development, production, evaluation and dissemination of new urologic audio-visual educational material across multiple platforms; and maintenance and organization of the Association's audio-visual library.

Committee Meetings

The committee will participate in approximately 2-3 teleconferences annually (1-1.5 hours per call), and once at an in-person meeting at the AUA Headquarters in Linthicum, Maryland in March/April. Some years, a teleconference may be substituted for an in-person meeting. Additionally, there will be ad hoc email and telephone correspondence through the year.

Time Commitment

Chair: 30-40 hours annually

Member: 15-25 hours annually

Qualifications/ Responsibilities

Chair: The majority of the work of the Committee Chair is facilitating the review process and assignment of video abstracts for video sessions at the Annual Meeting and the Core Curriculum. This position plays a major role in what abstracts are presented at the Annual Meeting and integrated into the Core Curriculum. The Chair is responsible for the videos selected to be in the Surgical Video Library which is used as an integral educational tool. The Chair will provide leadership for new urologic video projects and has overall responsibility for the work of the committee including the makeup and marketing strategy.

The Chair shall be a member of the Education Council and will be responsible for the production of new urologic videos for the Annual Meeting and Core Curriculum.

Members: Committee members may have up to 40 videos to review for the Annual Meeting. They select the



video abstracts to be presented in their session and then moderate that session in conjunction with selected experts in the field at the Annual Meeting. They may also assist in the review of Core Curriculum videos.
