

Urologic Video Education Committee An Education Council Subcommittee

Terms of Office Chair: 3 years (non-renewable)

Members: 3 years (renewable once)

Committee Makeup

The committee shall consist of approximately ten (10) Active or Senior Members who shall serve terms of three years. Members will be selected based on known expertise across different domains in urology, with at least one member having focused area of interest in the following urologic surgical areas: Oncology, Voiding Dysfunction, Endourology, Trauma/Reconstruction, Female Pelvic Medicine, and Pediatrics. Areas of need will be continuously monitored and adjusted as necessary.

Vision/Mission/Purpose

The Committee is responsible for the surgical video educational materials shown at the Annual Meeting; development, production, evaluation and dissemination of new urologic surgical video educational material across multiple platforms; and maintenance and organization of the Association's surgical video library.

Committee Meetings

The committee will participate in approximately 2 teleconferences annually (1-1.5 hours per call). Some years, a teleconference may be substitued for an in-person meeting. Additionally, there will be ad hoc email and telephone correspondence through the year.

Time Commitment

Chair: 30-40 hours annually Member: 15-25 hours annually

Responsibilities

Chair:

The majority of the work of the Committee Chair is facilitating the review process and assignment of video abstracts for video sessions at the Annual Meeting and the Core Curriculum. This position plays a major role in which abstracts are presented at the Annual Meeting and intergrated into the Core Curriculum. The Chair is responsible for the videos selected to be in the Surgical Video Library which is used as an intergral educational tool. The Chair will provide leadership for new urologic video projects and has overall responsibility for the work of the committee including the makeup and marketing strategy.

The Chair shall be a member of the Education Council.

Members: Committee members may have up to 40 videos to review for the Annual Meeting. They select the video abstracts to be presented in their session and then moderate that session in conjunction with selected experts in the field at the Annual Meeting. They will also assist in the review of Core Curriculum videos.

Compliance

Committee positions are open to AUA members in good standing. Criteria for Selecting New Members

- Expertise in one or more urologic specialties.
- Excellent organizational skills and communication skills required to review and critique surgical videos and moderate video abstract sessions.
- So that the AUA is in compliance with ACCME Standards, Members of Office of Education committees are not permitted to have financial relationships with ineligible companies (formerly commercial interests) that the ACCME would deem to be that of an owner or employee. Owners are defined as individuals who have an ownership interest in a company, except for stockholders of publicly traded companies, or holders of shares through a pension or mutual fund. Employees are defined as individuals hired to work for another person or business (the employer) for compensation and who are subject to the employer's direction as to the details of how to perform the job.

Criteria for Selecting Next Chair

The Chair should have exceptional organizational, communication and leadership skills. The next chair is chosen from current or past committee members and is selected by the Education Chair.
