The Core Curriculum Editorial Committee consists of members with expertise in one or more of the core curriculum categories listed below. Member appointments are based on expertise in areas of specialization, and are formally made by the President, upon unanimous recommendation of the Chair and approval of the Education Chair.

Mission/Vision/Purpose

Responsibilities

Chair: The Chair of Education and the Chair of the Core Curriculum Editorial Committee will determine the frequency cycle for reviews of the Core Curriculum sections. It is anticipated that annual reviews will be conducted by the members of the Core Curriculum Editorial Committee who will make formal recommendations to the Education Council for modifications to the curriculum. The Chair is a member of the Education Council.

Members: Each member is an expert in one of the twenty-four Core Curriculum categories. If necessary, members may invite other experts in their category areas to assist in reviewing and authoring the Core Curriculum sections/chapters. These experts assist the members in identifying discrepancies and making recommendations for updates. Members are responsible for ensuring their assigned sections are up to date, and will annually submit a report to the Chair including any changes or recommendations to their assigned sections.

Compliance

Positions on Councils, Committees, Editorial Boards and Practice Guidelines Panels are open to AUA members in good standing. Criteria for Selecting New Members

- Expertise in one of the twenty-four Core Curriculum categories with current openings.
- Excellent written communication skills are required to review and revise educational resources within the core curriculum.
- So that the AUA is in compliance with ACCME Standards, Members of Office of Education committees are not permitted to have financial relationships with ineligible companies (formerly commercial interests) that the ACCME would deem to be that of an owner or employee. Owners are defined as individuals who have an ownership interest in a company, except for stockholders of publicly traded companies, or holders of shares through a pension or mutual fund. Employees are defined as individuals hired to work for another person or business (the employer) for compensation and who are subject to the employer's direction as to the details of how to perform the job.

Criteria for Selecting Next Chair

- The Chair should have exceptional organizational, communication and leadership skills. Chairs are chosen from current or past committee members and are selected by the Education Chair.
